

HAS THE TRUE ESSENCE OF LIT ERATURE BEEN ALTERED BY ALLPROPOSITIONTHE SOCIALMEDIA HYPE?OPPOSITION

Side proposition strongly believes that the true essence of literature has been altered with all the social media hype. Social media has fundamentally changed the way people consume information and form opinions. Social media platforms are designed to deliver short bursts of information quickly, and as a result, people are often less likely to take the time to read longer, more complex works of literature. 




