Book Review

"A THOUSAND SPLENDID SUNS"



"I will follow you to the ends of the world."

This quote epitomizes the depth of familial bonds, such as those between father and son or mother and daughter. One of my favorite authors, Khalid Hosseini, is renowned for setting his stories against the most brutal surroundings while focusing on the simplest of human relationships. Perhaps, this is where the charm of his storytelling lies—in the raw and timeless abyss of humanity, where everything is at stake.

"A Thousand Splendid Suns" works on some very vulnerable premises- What happens when two women are left to fend for themselves, in a situation where they bear the same burden? What happens when the illusion of a perfect future, made in the innocence of childhood, goes crashing down? What occurs when a nation is ripped apart into fragments, time and time again, by a plethora of forces determined to control everyone's life?

Exploring these questions, on an almost disturbing personal level, is where the book shines. The book never lets go of the struggles, and yet never tries to pass judgements from the Western perspective, either directly or subtly.

Rather, it takes things as they are, and explores the impacts of this reality with simplicity. By the end of the journey, the characters of Laila and Mariam leave a deep imprint on our minds.

Hosseini quoted in this book, "But the fact is, when the past is shattered and the future is uncertain, all that is left is the present." This really hits home when you think about Laila and Mariam. Their lives are a testament to the strength and bravery needed to survive and find meaning in the present, even when everything around them is falling apart.

Now that the Taliban has unfortunately returned, it is all the more necessary for us to understand the struggles that the Afghan people face on a daily basis ,especially women and the beautiful endurance they possess. With reports of increasing restrictions on women's rights and liberties, this book provides crucial insights into the resilience and strength of Afghan women. "A Thousand Splendid Suns" can be a good start for this understanding.

THE MISSING 54: A 53 YEAR OLD WAIT FOR TRUTH

Wing Commander Abhinandan Varthaman may have come back from Pakistan after spending two days in their custody thanks to international pressure but the kin of 1971 prisoners of war have been waiting for 53 years for the return of their 54 army personnels.

India and Pakistan have a long history of conflict, having gone to war over territorial disputes in 1947-48 and 1965. The 1971 Indo-Pakistani War resulted in a decisive victory for India, leading to the creation of Bangladesh from what was then East Pakistan.

The missing 54 are the 54 soldiers and officers of the Indian armed forces who went missing in action during the Indo - Pakistani war of 1971 and whom the Indian government believes to be secretly held by Pakistan. Pakistan still denies the existence of such POWs.

India believes the 54 soldiers went missing in action and are held in Pakistani prisons. But more than five decades after they disappeared, there's no clarity over their numbers and fate. In 1971, India captured 93,007 Prisoners Of War, out of which 72,795 were Pakistani soldiers. Later, all of them were sent back to Pakistan as per the Shimla Agreement and under the provisions of the Geneva Convention on POWs. While India fulfilled its duty as a mature nation, Pakistan did just the opposite. For the last 52 years, India has been waiting for information on the whereabouts of its 54 soldiers, officers and fighter pilots who were captured as POWs by the hostile nation sitting right next to us.

In 1983 six people and in 2007, 14 people went to Pakistan to find any possible information on Missing 54, but they alleged that the Pakistani Government did not cooperate and were stonewalled.

Their families are still waiting, not giving up or losing hopes,knowing they might not be alive now, but they are waiting,waiting for the truth to finally come out.

While not having the truth, the only thing they can have is hope, isn't it?

This is still a mystery, a mystery that is yet to be discovered, to be known.






SWISS CAILLER CHOCOLATE FACTORY


